New research funded by GambleAware to apply behavioural insights to reduce problem gambling

London, 25 January: GambleAware has commissioned Dr Michael Hallsworth and colleagues at the Behavioural Insights Team to conduct a third phase of GambleAware's remote gambling research programme, aimed at developing and testing interventions to reduce gambling-related harm.

Phase one of the remote gambling research programme surveyed current industry practice in identifying and intervening in harmful gambling activities. The research identified a lot of variation in the markers being used and showed that industry operators struggle to identify problem gamblers in practice. The goal of phase two, therefore, was to explore whether exploratory data analysis could yield markers or patterns of behaviour which may indicate that customers are experiencing, or are at risk of experiencing, gambling-related harm.

This third phase of research will focus on testing interventions for operators to reduce harm once problematic gambling behaviour has been identified. The Behavioural Insights Team aim to generate evidence which will be used to develop harm minimisation best practice guidelines for the remote industry, including principles and tools and resources to support execution.

Clare Wyllie, Director of Research and Evaluation, said:

"We are very pleased to be working with the Behavioural Insights Team, who have a track record of using behavioural science to develop simple, practical ways of supporting positive behaviour change. It is an important development that the team will be applying their expertise to safer gambling for the first time."
